

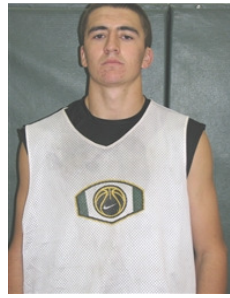
COYOTES HONORED FOR SUCCESS ON / OFF COURT

After winning the Mesa Junior High Championship with Fremont, Freshman Jonathon Sims hopped in a car and threw on a Coyote jersey while driving to Perry High School, the #1 ranked basketball team in the East Valley Region.

With three minutes to go in the first quarter, Coach Wirth gave the signal and an enthused Jonathon

Sims checked into the game and did what he does best, play basketball. The Coyotes won in a thrilling fashion, 61-59, beating the #1 ranked East Valley Region team.

The 6'6 freshman played in the Coyotes last six contests, starting in five of them. In his last four games, Sims averaged 10 pts and 10 rebounds for the Coyotes. Sims is the only freshman in Skyline Basketball history to do this.

Skyline's Jake Pitcher Receives Scholarship

Despite season ending injury, Pitcher able to accomplish dream of playing college basketball

On April 2nd, Jake Pitcher, a 6'6 senior forward from Skyline High School signed a national letter of intent to play college basketball at Morningside College in Sioux City, Iowa, inside the Rosen Verdoorn Sports Center on Morningside's campus.

Previously, Morningside College was an NCAA Division II program. In 2002, Morningside joined the Great Plains Athletic Conference (NAIA Division II).

Coach Dustin Cooper, Skyline's lead assistant, played at Morningside from 1999-2004 winning a GPAC championship and finishing the 2004 regular season 22nd in the Country. In 2008, Morningside was ranked number one in the country for most of the season.

"It is really exciting for Jake to get the opportunity to play college basketball at the same college I went to. I can't wait to go back and see him play," says Cooper.

The Morningside College coaches are glad to have him and hope for more Skyline recruits.

"Jake is a great kid that is very fundamentally sound. We are fortunate to sign Jake and look forward to him progressing into a great player at Morningside" states Brad Schmit, Morningside's top assistant and head recruiter.

"We hope to recruit more Skyline players in the future, as well."

Pitcher averaged 18 points and 9 rebounds as a junior whose Skyline team competed in the Arizona Class 5A Pima Region. He was named 1st team All Pima Region, Honorable Mention All-State, and was named to the 2008-09 Arizona Basketball Coaches Association Underclassmen All-Star Team.

In Pitcher's senior season, he suffered a season ending injury, breaking his foot, just three days before Skyline's season opener.

Despite missing his final year of high school basketball, Pitcher finished his career in the top 10 in scoring, rebounds and is Skyline's all-time leader in charges taken.

Pitcher will graduate in May with a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.5.

Michael Wirth, Skyline's head coach states, "There is not a kid more deserving of a chance to live out his dreams of playing college basketball, especially considering what happened to him his senior season. Morningside is lucky to have him."
